Faith Formation:

Forming ourselves in our Catholic faith is a foundational element in helping each of us understand and live in the example of Christ.

Adult Faith formation is supported in the following ways:

- Adult faith ambassadors lead staff in liturgies throughout the year
- Weekly staff liturgies during the seasons of Advent and Lent
- Invitations to the parent community to join in school liturgical celebrations Student faith formation is supported in the following ways:
- Youth Faith Ambassador Program which supports and facilitates a wide variety of faith-based activities throughout the school
- Daily, school-wide prayer
- Celebration of the monthly virtues and OCSGE through student-led liturgies
- Student-led liturgies to celebrate relevant feast days and seasons of the liturgical calendar (i.e., Advent, Lent)
- Student-led presentations and school-wide announcements, teaching students of all ages about important aspects of our Faith (i.e., the liturgical calendar, virtues, saints, tenets of our faith, Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations, stewardship)
- Student-led class liturgies in the school Chapel
- School staff work in collaboration with the St. Ursula Parish pastoral team in faith formation and preparation for sacraments
- Consistent modelling of Gospel-values and faith practice
- Intentional and explicit inclusion of a distinctive Catholic worldview across all subject areas

Sacramental Preparation:

As Catholics, we understand sacraments to be "outward signs instituted by Christ to give grace." Together in partnership with our parish, we support the preparation of God's children in receiving the sacraments.

Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

At St. Ursula School, the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE) are integrated in the teaching and learning in all our classrooms, from kindergarten to Grade 8, as Catholic education views human life as an integration of body, mind, and spirit. Our instructional practices reflect the knowledge, skills and mindsets embodied in these expectations, and we recognize the importance of the development of the whole child in terms of values, attitudes, and actions. We strive to fulfill our Vision & Mission by working together with all stakeholders to providing our students with the knowledge and wisdom required to meet the Ontario Catholic Graduate Expectations.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

We recognize our Catholic virtues during morning prayers and monthly student led virtue assemblies. Classroom teachers incorporate direct teaching of the virtues throughout their program. Students who demonstrated and modeled the virtue of the month are recognized and presented an award during monthly virtue celebrations.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

Our call to discipleship and service are evident throughout St. Ursula School. Each classroom has a clearly identifiable Sacred Space in a prominent place which can serve as a focus for classroom prayer and reflection. The seasons of the liturgical year are represented in these

sacred spaces. As visitors are welcomed to St. Ursula the Catholic identity of our community is evident immediately upon entry through the altar and sacred space present in the foyer of the building. We have several murals throughout the school building representative of our beliefs and Catholic faith. As well, the St. Ursula prayer room is a sacred space where students and staff are invited to gather for the purposes of liturgies, reflections, and quiet prayer. Staff and students answer the call to service in many ways as well, including the collection of donations of food, money, clothing, and personal needs items, for various campaigns throughout the year (i.e., Food Drives, Collections for Dr. Simone, Christmas outreach projects, and ShareLife). These visible reminders, and opportunities to serve others, help us to focus our learning and interactions on the key tenets of our shared faith, and to ensure that our Catholic faith is lived out daily at St. Ursula School.
